



Dear Parents

The Summer Term is going by so quickly, with so many trips, events and activities happening in school. At the end of the Spring Term, we were visited by the Independent Schools Inspection team for a full inspection. We were delighted that the inspectors found the school to be Excellent in all areas. Double Excellent is the best result possible from a full educational quality and focused compliance inspection. I would like to thank our staff for their hard work and commitment and parents for their support. Here are a few of the comments taken directly from the ISI report (the full report can be found on our website):

‘Pupils’ academic and non-academic achievements are excellent. They attain highly and make rapid progress from their starting points.’

‘In all lessons seen, pupils concentrated extremely well and were highly engaged with the topic, consistently demonstrating a diligent approach to learning.’

‘Pupils develop aspirational attitudes because they experience typically very dynamic, pacy and enthusiastic teaching that motivates and excites them.’

‘Pupils’ confidence and readiness to persevere stem from staff’s very warm relationships with pupils, characterised by a preponderance of praise and encouragement.’

‘The oldest pupils’ books exhibit advanced subject knowledge across the whole range of subjects. For example, pupils record scientific information clearly, making effective use of diagrams, accurate use of scientific notation and calculations using the correct units.’

‘By the time they reach the end of the Reception year, a higher proportion of children in the EYFS attain a good level of development than those in early years settings nationally, with school data indicating that high percentages of these children attain beyond national expectations.’

‘Pupils’ books contain work of high quality in all areas of mathematics.’

‘Pupils’ communication skills are outstanding.’

‘Pupils display outstanding moral behaviour and values. Behaviour seen throughout the inspection across the school was uniformly excellent.’


## Years 1 & 2 Trip to The Barbican and The Charterhouse
