

# Head's Newsletter

Autumn Term 2023 – Nov/Dec

**Dear Parents** 

It is difficult to believe that we have already completed our first term and Christmas is around the corner. It has been a busy but wonderful end to the Autumn term here at Clifton Lodge and my warm thanks to all members of the community who have helped to make it such a success. This newsletter brings together some of the exciting activities that have gone on over the past few weeks, culminating in our Christmas performances and service at Christ the Saviour Church – I hope you enjoy looking through them.

#### **Remembrance Assembly**

On Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November, we held a special assembly at Christ the Saviour Church. This Remembrance Assembly included performances from our Choir and Pre-Prep Choir, instrumentalists, whole school singing and poetry. Our Deputy Head Boy & Deputy Head Girl recited the poem 'In Flanders Fields' and our Head Boy & Girl read a prayer. We were delighted that Father Richard joined us. Thank you to everyone who took part and to our parents for their support. Our pupils, parents and staff raised £225 for the Royal British Legion, which together with a school donation of £200, totalled £425.



# Year 2 – Ancient Egyptian Workshop

On Tuesday, 7th November, our Year 2 pupils spent the day absorbing themselves in a fun and interactive workshop which concluded their learning in school on the fascinating and enigmatic world of the Ancient Egyptians.

Throughout the morning, the children created a number of artefacts to bring home. These included a mummified peg, ushabtis dolls, mini clay canopic **j**ars, clay scarab charms on a bracelet or necklace, scarab carving on soap stone, and ink making. They even wrote passages from the book of the dead on papyrus paper and finally made perfume cones with crushed spices and melted bees wax.

In the afternoon, pupils recreated the festival of Wepet-Renpet: The Opening of the Year. They also practised and then performed the dramatic stories of The Lamentations of Isis and Nephthys, The Tale of Osiris and The Dance of the Wax Crocodile. Others were slaves and attendants, Chuhang was chosen to be Pharaoh Tutankhamun and Freya, Queen Ankhesenamun.

# Anti-Bullying Week

Week commencing Monday 13th November was Anti-Bullying Week and this year's theme was 'Make Some Noise'. Our pupils took part in an activity each day, kicking off the week with Odd Socks Day on the Monday. They took part in workshops about 'Kindness, Respect and Cyber Safety' delivered by Bigfoot Arts Education - HQ as well as completing activities linked to Anti-Bullying week.

Anti-Bullying Week helps our school to shine a spotlight on bullying and encourages all children, teachers, and parents to take action against bullying throughout the year. During the first half of the autumn term at Clifton Lodge we had been concentrating on our School Virtue of Love, thinking of how we can positively work with each other and grow together as a family. From parents and carers to teachers and politicians and children and young people, we all have a part to play in coming together to make a difference. During the workshop, they explored all the wildlife across the world, learning about the different terrains and habitats.

# Year 3 – Ancient Greek Day Workshop

As a part of their history unit on Ancient Greece, Year 3 had their Ancient Greek Day at school on Tuesday 21st November and dressed up in traditional costumes!

The pupils were taught by the Greek God Dionysus and the first session consisted of stories of myths and legends where the children were transported to a Greek theatre to re-enact tales of the Greek Gods and Goddesses.

Other morning activities included, a Greek quiz, Archimedes' Stomachion (the oldest known mathematical puzzle), and Petteia (the Greek strategy game).

After lunch, the Greek hoplite soldier demonstrated his weapons and armour. He taught the children the differences between the city states of Athens and Sparta, the children took a lesson in democracy and competed in a mini–Olympic Games as well as practising battle commands!

Theodore - "Acting as Cronos was really cool!"


Tara - "I loved acting and I played Hera!"
