Just before half term, the results started to roll in – and what a fantastic crop of results have been achieved this year! The children have received offers from a number of highly prestigious schools, including Latymer Upper, City of London, Godolphin and Latymer, Hampton and Merchant Taylors' to name just a few. I am particularly proud to report that this year's cohort have also broken the record in terms of scholarships – no fewer than seven academic scholarships were offered to Clifton Lodge children with words of praise for all applicants on how they performed and how they held themselves at interview. Year 6 Science - Using microscopes to observe plant cells, animal cells and micro-organisms

This term, Year 6 are learning about 'Classifying Living Things' and over the past few weeks, they have been learning about the structure of plant cells, animal cells and micro-organisms.

Firstly, the pupils were tasked with growing some mould on various foods over about a week. Next, they observed a plant cell (onion), animal cell (inside of their cheek) and fungus (mould) under a light microscope.

The class learned how to use the microscopes correctly, such as starting out with the lowest magnification to improve the field of view. They observed the structure of the cells (cell walls, cell membranes, cytoplasm and nucleus for example). Furthermore, in terms of classification, they noted that mould is classified as a eukaryote, meaning its cells contains a nucleus and other membrane-bound organelles.









Nursery visit to Ealing Fire Station

We are so grateful to Ealing Fire Station for welcoming our Nursery class on the afternoon of Wednesday, 31st January. The children absolutely loved the experience of seeing the fire engines up close, trying out the equipment (especially the water hoses!) and meeting the real fire fighters.

Charlie – "I used the fire extinguisher to put the fake fire out."

Ella – "I used the water hose, it was very fast."

Eloise – "I enjoyed using the water hose and driving the fire truck. The fire truck was very big and loud."

Alfie – "I went into the fire truck and put the helmet on."









Reception Trip & Topic - The Solar System

The Reception class has been learning about the exciting topic of Space. The children explored all about gravity, the planets, stars, orbits and everything related to the Solar System. They also learned about life on the International Space Station which they found fascinating. To explore more about this topic, the class visited the Science Museum on Wednesday 7th February to see the Space Gallery and take part in a workshop. It was a wonderful day out and we are very grateful to the parents who came along to help.

Here are some quotes from our pupils:



Children get awarded a Pen Licence for consistently good, legible handwriting across all subjects and for making sure that their work and exercise books are always neatly presented.






Art & Construction Club
